**History and Tour of the Veterans' Building**

**Chung Mei Heritage Day - December 18, 2013 - El Cerrito City Hall**

Another table will have Chung Mei Chronicle handouts for folks to take. Tom will set up the sound system for those who may want to speak. Some large photos and the letter about the Chung Mei Home Historic District finding of eligibility will be on display.

## **Other Business**

### Sparks

The Board approved Tom as the final editor for all future editions of the Sparks Newsletter.

### Lincoln Highway Magazine Subscription

The Board approved renewing the \$45.00 subscription for one more year.

### Rodini House

Tom reported that the design and style of this development have been greatly improved. It now includes leaving the creek completely intact, hopefully including the stone wall and bed. The house would be moved to the back of the lot on the south side of the creek. The current plan includes open space in front of the house but it is not clear if this public space. Tom will be advocating for historical interpretation in this space similar to what was done for the Eden Housing Project. This project proposal will likely come to the Planning Commission in January or February.

### Mabuchi/Eden Housing

The latest proposal, which includes a remarkable tribute to El Cerrito's Japanese Heritage, will be presented for approval at the Planning Commission tomorrow night at 7:30 p.m.

### Draft Historic Resources Ordinance and Context Statement

Tom has continued his efforts to spread the knowledge embodied in the draft El Cerrito Historic Context Statement by distributing the parts that affect current projects in the City. He feels that the current staff is open to both the draft Context Statement and draft Historic Resources Ordinance. Perhaps this open attitude will lead to adoption in the next few years even though this goal was dropped out of the 5-Year Strategic Plan. He thinks this may be the year someone from the California State office speaks to the Council or the Planning Commission.

### Portola Middle School Museum Idea

Marne Mufti has contacted Dave about Portola Middle School eventually having a mini-museum similar to the one at El Cerrito High School. The Board would like to hear more about this. Dave will investigate and report back on their latest plans/ideas.

### Human Resources Commission's Annual - Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Parade

#### 25th Anniversary in El Cerrito - January 20, 2014

Pat Durham from the Human Resources Committee hopes to make this year's parade a bigger event than usual. She is asking if the Historical Society would like to have a table at the parade ending site. The parade starts at the DMV at 9:30 a.m. and proceeds to the high school. The event usually wraps up at about 12:30. Joanne and Barbara both said they could spend a couple of hours there. The Board will make a final decision via e-mail once the details of the plan are confirmed by the City in January.

### Shadi Room Donation

An anonymous donor has asked if there were any items or materials they could purchase for the Shadi Room. The Board approved accepting the donation. Tom, Barbara and Joanne will work on this. Barbara noted that finding something to take the "mucilage" off the back of old photos would be great.
