Over the years El Cerrito's Veterans Memorial Hall fell into disrepair. But it was saved by local veterans who stepped in to preserve the building. Today the County still owns the property and provides exterior and other major maintenance. The Veterans Memorial Building Association operates the building and some vets still meet there. Many organizations and individuals rent the Hall, which helps fund interior maintenance. Just as when it it first opened in 1932, the Hall can be rented. LOUIS CHRISTOPHER HAGEN, JR.

The United States entered Word War I in April of 1917. In June Louis Christopher Hagen, Jr., a grandson of El Cerrito pioneers Christian & Madeline Hagan (later changed to Hagen) and Patrick & Johanna Sullivan, registered for the draft. He was 25 years old and single. He was working for Union Iron Works at the Alameda shipyards at the time. Louis was listed on his draft card as medium height and build with brown hair and blue eyes.


As a private in the Army's American Expeditionary Forces he was sent to Camp Green in North Carolina. Here he joined the Army's newly formed 3rd Division and was in training for about five months. There were about 28,000 men in the 3rd Division. The 3rd Division shipped out to France in April 1918. At first they were under French command and held the Germans back at the Marne River in France.

A short time later Maj. General Joseph Dickman became their commander and issued his famous edict in French, "Nous resterons la" ("We're staying there!") It was along the Marne on July 15 that the 3rd Division took the brunt of what was to be the last German offensive of the war. As units on either side of the division were driven back, the men of the 30th and 38th Regiments held their ground.

This feat, in which they stood their ground as if they were a rock, was called by Gen. John "Blackjack" Pershing "...one of the most brilliant pages in the annals of military history." It earned the division its nickname, "Rock of the Marne." Louis C. Hagen, Jr. was killed in that battle. He was buried at the American Cemetery "Oise-Asne" in Fere-en-Tardenoisan, France.

Built in 1932 as a memorial for veterans of the Great War, the Veterans Building continues to play an important role in El Cerrito. Veterans Memorial Hall

El Cerrito's Veterans Memorial Hall at 6401 Stockton Avenue is one of the original thirteen memorials built in the 1920s and 1930s in Contra Costa County to honor veterans. They were designed to be a place for veterans to meet and also as community centers, libraries and town meeting halls. Counties were authorized by the U.S. and California State government to raise funds through a temporary sales tax to build Veteran Memorials. In 1922 the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors voted to approve this building program county-wide. Each American Legion Post had to petition for the funds they needed. Our site was chosen for its (then) central location.

Veterans in El Cerrito formed the American Legion Louis Hagen Post 340 on November 16, 1928. The post was named after Louis C. Hagen, Jr. who was one of the first young men from El Cerrito to die in World War I. There were 27 veterans at the first meeting. They chose Louis Davis as their first Commander. Contra Costa County appropriated \$22,500 to purchase the land and build a Veterans Memorial Hall. The Louis Hagen Post 340 met at other sites in town before moving into the building on Stockton Avenue. Efforts to build the El Cerrito Veterans Memorial Hall began in 1929 and the building was dedicated on September 24, 1932.

The building itself was designed by the prominent architect James T. Narbett, who was assisted by his son Keith. It cost \$20,000 to build and was the only steel-reinforced concrete Memorial building in the county. The main floor included a large auditorium with a stage. Two lounges were off the stage. The second floor included offices and several meeting rooms. The building also contained a kitchen. The Veterans Memorial Association provided the furnishings.

The 1932 newspaper listed prominent veterans at the time who were instrumental in getting the Memorial Hall built. Some of those listed were H. Nissen, P. Lee, A. Bertoli, F. Begerow, C.

Schwake, F. Prosser, and J. Westbrook. Members of the Louis Hagen Auxiliary (wives, daughters, sisters, mothers of vets) were mentioned in the news article as well. Some of those were H. Alllinio, F. Breneman, B. Brodt, E. Staley, K. Hagen, L. Peralta.

The El Cerrito Journal, our local newspaper at the time, put out a front page spread on the 1932 event. A large parade started the celebration on Saturday, September 24, 1932 at 2:30 PM. The parade began at Cutting Boulevard and San Pablo Avenue. It was led by the 143rd Field Artillery Band and the Grand Marshall was William F. Huber. The parade went down San Pablo Avenue to the county line and back to Veterans Hall.

Most community organizations and other local veteran groups participated in the parade. The celebration was




thought to be the largest event ever held in the community. After the parade there was a dedication ceremony followed by a buffet supper open to everyone. Later in the evening a "Dedication Ball" was held at the Hall and was open to the community as well.

Mayor J. R. Beck, who served in the Army during World War I, wrote an article commending the veterans, the American Legion Post and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) for their hard work. He also encouraged the community of El Cerrito to use the building as a community center. He noted: "This is a happy moment for the city and all its citizens, and the completion and dedication of the Memorial Hall will live long as a milestone in the progress of El Cerrito."

A Brief History of the American Legion

Lt. Col. Teddy Roosevelt, Jr., the oldest son of our 26th president, Theodore Roosevelt, was at General Headquarters in Paris four months after the end of World War I. His youngest brother Quentin Roosevelt had died when his plane was shot down behind enemy lines in the war.

Lt. Col. T. Roosevelt, Jr. and several others got approval to invite enlisted troops and officers to a "caucus" in Paris to come up with ways to boost morale for the troops waiting to get back home. After that meeting he suggested starting an organization to support and honor the troops. Things were set in motion in March of 1919 to start the American Legion. The organization was officially formed two months later in St. Louis, Missouri.


